Over the past five years, JCCC has been successful in securing over \$19.7 million in grant funding from public and private sources that has supported innovation and provided needed programs and services to the college community.

Audrey Michaelis, Associate Professor, Fashion Merchandising & Design, was awarded funding to enhance students' research and use of cotton fabrics through the design and creation of a draped ensemble. Funds were used to purchase materials for students, as well as provide prizes for students with the top 3 final projects.

Workforce Development & Continuing Education received funding through the State Fiscal Recovery Fund to support purchasing land and constructing a dedicated training range with classroom space for the Commercial Driver's License training program in Edgerton, KS. 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U.S. Department of Education / Kansas Board of Regents Perkins Reserve Fund FY23



Led by Christina Rudacille, Director of Practical Nursing & Health Occupations, this funding purchased textbooks, stethoscopes, and other supplies for up to 15 students who otherwise would not be able to afford them. These students will be able to borrow these supplies and textbooks at the beginning of each semester through a checkout system.

Courtney Hultgren, Program Director of the Hiersteiner Child Development Center (HCDC), oversees this grant to award scholarships to Pell-eligible student-parents to cover up to 95% of the tuition for their child (1 year and walking to 6 years). Grant funding also provides professional development for HCDC staff.

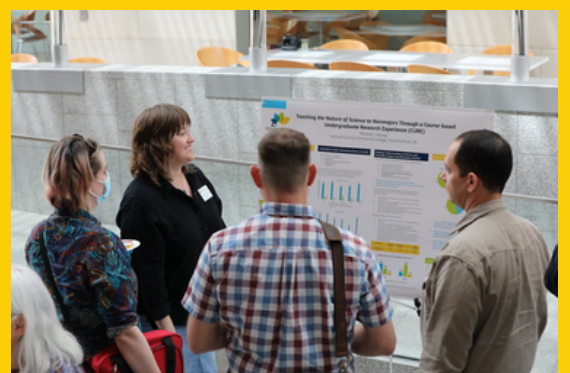

Through this award, Workforce Development & Continuing Education funds tuition for 15 veterans or their immediate family members to enroll in the JCCC's Commercial Driver's License training program.

Dr. Melanie Harvey, Professor, Chemistry and Dr. Heather Seitz, Professor, Biology lead this project to build a sustainable Course-Based Undergraduate Research Experience (CURE) Program at JCCC by having faculty teams create, pilot, and evaluate CUREs for their science classes. In addition, workshops and a conference will be held to foster adoption of CURE pedagogy in the region.

With this funding, JCCC was able to purchase food products and personal care items that were distributed through the Student Basic Needs Center. In addition, 23 students received emergency assistance grants, up to \$1,500. Finally, a portion of the funding supported the MealSHARE program for qualified students.
