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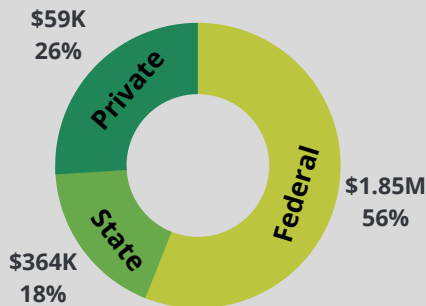

National Endowment for the Arts Grants for Arts Projects

The Midwest Trust Center's Arts Education programming, led by Program Director Kara Armstrong, facilitated professional development in arts integration for K-12 educators. To ensure the health and safety of the participants, programming was offered virtually, allowing teachers from beyond the Kansas City Metropolitan Area to participate.



In FY21, the Grants office worked with **15** faculty/staff who were new to grants.

League for Innovation in the Community College

Project Firstline: Infection Control in the Community College Curriculum

Professors Kelle Oestreich and Anthony Randall in the Respiratory Care program collaborated with healthcare faculty across the country to enhance current infection control curriculum over the summer. The faculty piloted and evaluated the updated curriculum during the Fall 2021 semester.

Kansas Department of Commerce Jobs and Innovative Industry Skills Training

The Welding/Metal Fabrication program was awarded funding to purchase six new lathes to replace its current equipment. With these new lathes, students in the program gain the broad range of skills that employers need in welders.



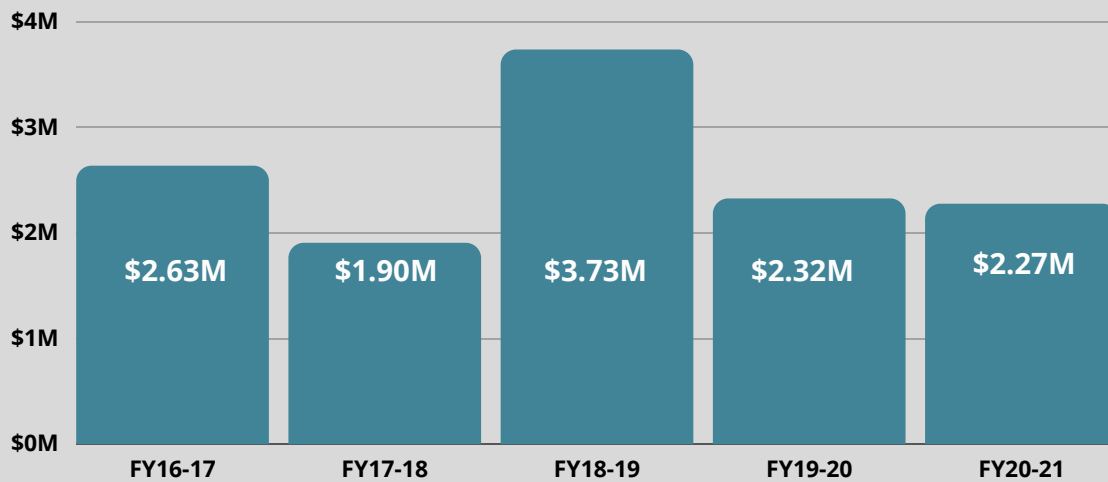

Over the past five years, JCCC has been successful in securing over \$12.85 million in grant funding from public and private sources that has supported innovation and provided needed programs and services to the College community.

HIGHLIGHT OF EXISTING GRANTS

U.S. Department of Transportation

Commercial Motor Vehicle Operator Safety Training (CMVOST)

Overseen by Josh Smith, Program Director, Continuing Education, JCCC provided scholarships to 20 veterans and/or their family members to complete the CDL-A program. These graduates also received job placement services into a professional truck driving position.

National Science Foundation

Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (S-STEM)

Professors Beth Edmonds and Suneetha Menon led this project to award scholarships to underrepresented, low income JCCC students whose goal is to major in a STEM field and transfer on to a university. Throughout the 5-year grant project, thirty-eight students were supported with scholarships.

U.S. Department of Agriculture, National Institute of Food and Agriculture

Secondary Education, Two-Year Postsecondary Education, and Agriculture in the Classroom (SPECA)

Professor Stu Shafer, Sustainable Agriculture Program, received this grant to expand the current Sustainable Agriculture certificate. The project involved creating 6 new courses, developing Open Education Resources to make courses nearly textbook free, partnering with high schools and universities in establishing a Sustainable Agriculture pipeline, and convening potential employer partners.
