HEALTH INFORMATION SYSTEMS Program Outlook



Employment of health information technicians is projected to grow 13 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations. The demand for health services is expected to increase as the population ages. Health information technicians typically need a postsecondary certificate to enter the occupation, although some may need an associate's degree. Certification is often required.
